### Goal

The Energy, Climate Change and  
Economic Security Act of 2008  
(Florida Statutes 403.7032)  
established a new statewide  
recycling goal of 75% by 2020

## Objectives

- Commercial Sector
  - Generates 66% of MSW with a recycling rate of 30%.
- Residential Sector
  - Generates a smaller amount of MSW (34%) than the commercial sector, the recycling rate is only 27%.
